



# WSDOT SR 509 Completion— South 216th Street Bridge Construction

he South 216th Street Bridge will close to eastbound traffic as early as Oct. 2023. The Washington State Department of Transportation is constructing a new bridge over Interstate 5 on South 216th Street as part of the SR 509 Completion Project.

WSDOT's contractor is carrying out the South 216th Street bridge replacement in phases. The first stage, building the new southern portion of the bridge, is already underway. In fall 2023,

WSDOT will shift westbound bridge traffic onto the newly constructed portion of the bridge. Eastbound traffic will be detoured to South 200th Street and SR 516 for about six months so that crews can demolish the old South 216th Street bridge and build the north portion of the new bridge. When complete, the new, wider bridge

will feature bike lanes, ADA-accessible sidewalks, and a new dedicated left turn lane onto Military Road South.







# **Barnes Creek/Kent- Des Moines Road Culvert Replacement Project**

ashington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) is constructing a new culvert beneath State Route 516, also known as Kent Des Moines Road, just west of 16th Avenue South. Barnes Creek is currently restricted by an aging culvert below the roadway. The replacement is part of WSDOT's fish passage program intended to correct barriers that impede fish migration.

At just 2 feet in diameter and built from clay, the existing culvert that carries Barnes Creek under SR 516 is a barrier for fish trying to swim upstream and is in danger of failing. This project will replace the small clay culvert with a new structure that is 20 feet wide and 9 feet tall, allowing fish and other wildlife to move freely up and down the creek.

Construction is scheduled to begin in August, 2023 and will include a nine-day full closure of SR 516. In order to complete the work safely and in a timely fashion, crews expect to keep SR 516 closed around-the-clock for nine days. A signed detour will direct travelers around the closure using 16th Avenue South, South 240th Street and Marine View Drive South.

# Exciting Developments at Redondo Beach: New Fishing Pier and Restroom Project Set to Begin

We are thrilled to announce a significant improvement coming to the Redondo neighborhood; the Redondo Fishing Pier and Restroom Projects.

The City is planning to advertise the projects for bid this fall, with construction work scheduled to commence in the first quarter of

This project will replace the existing deteriorated Redondo Fishing Pier and Restroom facilities. The new pier will be constructed from concrete and steel with composite grating for the walkways. The new restroom will be situated within the parking lot area east of Redondo Beach Drive South.

We understand the anticipation among the community for this long-awaited project and thank you for your patience. The in-water work for the fishing pier will begin around July, 2024, consistent with federal permit requirements.

# **24th Avenue South Improvements Project**

he 24th Avenue South Improvements Project was advertised for bids on June 14, 2023 with a public bid opening on July 11, 2023. SCI Infrastructure was the responsive low bidder and has been selected as the contractor for the project.

The project aims to make several improvements along 24th Ave S, between S 223rd St and S Kent-Des Moines Road. The proposed improvements include the construction of sidewalk, bike lanes, reduced travel lane widths for traffic calming, a two-way left turn lane, new storm drainage, and illumination. The project will improve non-motorized user safety with the construction of bike lanes and ADA sidewalks on both sides of the roadway and enhanced pedestrian crossings near Midway Elementary and Pacific Middle schools.

The construction of the 24th Avenue South Improvements Project is scheduled to begin in September, 2023 and anticipated to be completed in December, 2024. We sincerely thank the community for their patience and continued support throughout the project construction phase.

It's that time of year again!

When it comes to storm water, here are some things we can all do to protect our homes, property, and the local environment.

**GUTTERS:** Make sure your gutters are clean and working properly. This can reduce the potential for clogged drains and water backups.

DRAINAGE SYSTEMS: Understand your property's storm water system. A few common systems used throughout Des Moines are splash blocks, French drains, and dispersion trenches. Any type of system receives runoff from hard surfaces (roofs and driveways) using small basins and perforated pipe buried in gravel. Please contact the City for more information on how to identify and maintain these vital systems.

BASIN DEBRIS: Remove debris from basins. As leaves start to fall, make sure they are raked up and disposed of with your yard waste. Leaves and lawn clippings can plug basins and ditches, causing temporary flooding problems.

DRIVEWAYS & SIDEWALKS: Sweep driveways and sidewalks. It may take more time than pressure washing, but sweeping allows you to contain contaminants and dispose of them properly in the garbage. As with vehicles, driveways accumulate more than just dirt. Rubber from tires, metal from brake pads, and oil are some of the common things that build up on driveways. It is important to capture as much of these contaminants as possible, so they can be disposed of properly before washing into the Sound.

**PET WASTE:** Dispose of pet waste properly. Pet waste contains pathogens and nutrients that can have a negative impact on storm water runoff and the environment. Before going on walks, remember to bring pet waste bags. Remember to always dispose of pet waste bags into a garbage can.



The City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County. Services provided include but are not limited to:

**Electrical** – faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans

**Plumbing** – faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters

**Disability Aids** – installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces

**Safety** – installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets

**Other** – faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

#### How do I qualify for these free services?

- Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months, have proof of home owner's insurance, and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program.
- 2. Complete the application process

#### How do I apply?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

- Request an application by email at thickey@ desmoineswa.gov or by calling (206) 870-6535
- 2. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/ or safety are the highest priority.



# **Planning for Housing**

2023 was an eventful year for housing in the Washington State Legislature. Two of the bills passed that are generating the most questions to the City are the E2SHB 1110 – Middle Housing Bill and the EHB 1337 – Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Bill.



#### E2SHB 1110 - Middle Housing Bill

The stated purpose of this bill is to create more homes for Washington by increasing middle housing in areas traditionally dedicated to single-family detached housing. Middle housing is defined as buildings that are compatible in scale, form, and character with single-family houses and contain two or more dwelling units. Middle housing types can include duplexes, townhouses, cottage housing and others. Depending on the proximity to transit, between two and six housing units per lot would be allowed, provided development standards such as yard setbacks and lot coverage are met.

#### EHB 1337 - Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Bill

The stated purpose of this bill is to expand housing options by easing barriers to the construction and use of accessory

dwelling units. An accessory dwelling unit is one located on the same lot as a single-family or other housing unit. It can be located within, attached to, or detached from the primary dwelling. The bill includes provisions such as allowing two ADUs on each lot, limiting parking requirements, removing barriers to separate ownership, and increasing the maximum size.

There are a number of implementation timelines described in the bills. The associated updates to the Des Moines Municipal Code are required to be completed within six months of the periodic comprehensive plan update. The update currently underway (https://imaginedesmoines2044.com/) is to be completed by December 31, 2024. Six months after that would be June 2025. Additional information will be provided to the public as the State and cities develop draft regulations.




Engineering Services has welcomed three new staff members to the team in 2023.
